Philanthropists of the Year

Bill Burwinkel

Bill started his sales career in 1970 after serving with the U.S. Army in Vietnam. Following his military service, Bill founded NATIONAL MARKETSHARE GROUP inc. in 1983. With a focus on the future and their commitment to "Exceeding Customer and Principal Expectations", Bill assembled a team that believes in the importance of family, hard work, having the RIGHT ATTITUDE, giving back to the community and having fun. As chairman of the board for National Marketshare Group, Bill is focused on fulfilling their corporate philosophy of "Giving back to the community is an obligation, not an option".

Bill's commitment to the community runs deep. Bill served with the Boy Scouts of America on the 1997, 2001, 2005 and 2010 National Jamboree Committee and served on the Council Board of Directors for 21 years. He received the Council Scouter of the Month Award on several occasions and was awarded the Silver Beaver Award, scouting's highest non-scouting award. He has also been active throughout the Greater Cincinnati community having served on the Board of Price Hill Will, the Lower Price Hill Community Council, Co-chair of the Oyler School LSDMC, Chair of the Oyler Renovation Design Team, and Chair of the Oyler Green Initiatives Committee. Bill currently serves on the Board of Golden Gloves and as a Commissioner for the Board of Great Parks of Hamilton County. To further expand National Marketshare Group's commitment to the community, Bill created Adopt A Class Foundation in 2003. Their mission is to connect businesses and civic groups with students in economically challenged schools. By pairing teams with classrooms grades K-8, adult mentors expose students to a breadth of experiences and training to be job and career ready. Today, nearly 2,600 volunteers from over 120 businesses and community groups are paired with more than 6,000 students in 34 Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky schools. Bill continues to serve as a board of director, supports the organization financially and through significant time recruiting new corporate partners, and continues to mentor with the National Marketshare team at Holy Family School. Bill also started a sister nonprofit organization, Adopt A Class Endowment Fund, to ensure Adopt A Class will be able to sustain growth to serve all students in Greater Cincinnati.

In 1998, Bill and his wife Beth, received the Preservation Award from the Cincinnati Preservation Association for the renovation of the West End Bank Building which now serves as NATIONAL MARKETSHARE GROUP Inc. Corporate Headquarters. Bill is a 2009 graduate of the Cincinnati Chamber of Commerce Leadership Class XXXI and a Rotary Club nominee for the Jefferson Award. In 2008 Cincinnati Magazine recognized him as one of Cincinnati's "Most influential people in Education". In 2011 Bill received the Second Act Award for his work with Adopt A Class and in 2012, 4C for Children named Bill their "Champion for Children". In the same year the Junior League named Adopt A Class their 2011-2012 Community Service Award recipient. While Bill earned a GED Diploma during his service to our country, he has also received Honorary Diplomas from Oyler Community Learning Center and Elder High School. Bill is grateful to have been awarded many outstanding accolades throughout his career and time serving the community and would like to thank the Association of Fundraising Professionals of Greater Cincinnati for their recognition of Philanthropist of the Year.



Volunteer of the Year Stacey Meyer

Stacey is the Fine Wine Manager for Heidelberg Distributing Company in Cincinnati. She has worked with Heidelberg since 2004 and just had her anniversary on July 22nd! She grew up in Sharonville and attended Princeton High School (Class of 1996). She graduated from University of Cincinnati in 1999 and then again with a master's degree in 2004. In between studies, Stacey lived in Germany on two different Fulbright scholarships. Stacey is passionate about Fernside. My family attended Fernside after my mom's suicide in 1988. Once she turned 18, Stacey started volunteering as a group night facilitator and has continued this role to this day. She understands firsthand the importance of the work Fernside does, and she wants other children to experience the support she had in her grief journey. Grief is challenging journey, and no one should have to do it alone. She's so grateful to have had Fernside and attributes much of her success to their support.

Stacey's passion for wine & food (and Fernside, an affiliate of Hospice,) helped lead her to helping fundraise with Hospice of Cincinnati on a larger scale. A Gourmet Sensation was a food & wine event that she started to help about 13 years ago. They have evolved the event over the years, and it is now Gourmet Melodies, taking place on Saturday, August 13th!

Joseph is grateful that he has been able to use his gift to create a solution to social isolationism, and as such, has become committed to public service through music.

Joseph hopes to broaden the impact of POM, bringing the joy and connectivity of music to those in our community who need it most and envision it continuing well after he graduates from high school.



Outstanding Corporation/ Foundation

SugarCreek John & Julie Richardson

John was born in Chicago and has lived in several places before settling in Washington Court House Ohio where his dad, John Sinkler Richardson, built the first SugarCreek plant. At that time, we were strictly a bacon business. Today, that legacy remains a big part of our base, but we have expanded. SugarCreek is a food manufacturing co-packing company and John is Chairman of the Board. John took over the roughly \$50M business in 1990 from his father, John S Richardson. Since then, through organic growth, the business has grown to \$1B in 2021!

Through SugarCreek, John has been a contributor to his community and the communities that surround his operations for years. Everything from local sports teams to building low-cost housing and day care centers, to being a consistent supporter and sponsor for various fundraising events and campaigns, especially for Stepping Stones and La Soupe! Several years ago, SugarCreek started a rescue program to donate food that previously went to the landfill! That food goes back into our community to feed the hungry through organizations like La Soupe and Master Provisions. We have been rescuing 700k-900k lbs of food each year, most of which is protein – the golden egg in the world of feeding the hungry!

Lifetime Achievement in Fundraising

John Olberding

John C. Olberding is Principal of Chanticleer Consulting since 2010, and former President and CEO of Skystone Ryan, a Cincinnati-based firm with at one time 14 US offices and seven affiliate offices throughout the world. He has served a broad spectrum of organizations during his 40-year career in non-profit development, directing successful capital, annual and planned giving programs, executive searches and training and strategic plans for over 250 health, religious, educational, cultural, environmental and social service organizations both in his native Greater Cincinnati area and throughout the United States and internationally. His career began as a College Relations assistant at Baldwin-Wallace College and then Publications Director/Marketing Coordinator for the Cincinnati Reds.

An Evans Scholar graduate of Miami University, John is a past chapter Pesident of the Evans Scholars Alumni Association, supporting the largest private scholarship program in the United States. He did graduate work in theology at Mount St. Mary's Seminary where he also served as Director of Development before entering the consulting field with J. Donovan Associates of Salem Massachusetts. A second-generation fundraising professional, John's father Greg was in 1979 one of seven founding members of the Greater Cincinnati Chapter of what was then called the National Society of Fundraising Professionals (now AFP), and its third President. Gregory Olberding was honored as Fundraising Executive of the Year at the chapter's second celebration of National Philanthropy Day. John was himself the chapter's 11th President. He later served the AFP Board again as its Chair of National Philanthropy Day in 2001 and then Chairman of its Program Committee and co-founder and Chair of the chapter's SNAP program for seasoned professionals. He is a longtime participant in the AFP mentoring program and has through Chanticleer Consulting annually sponsored the AFP Holiday celebration. John was also a founding Board member of the Greater Cincinnati Planned Giving Council and served on the International Committee of AFP and its predecessor World Fundraising Council for over 30 years, twice Chairing its international visitor outreach program at its International Conference. John is a frequently featured speaker at professional conferences and is co-editor with fellow Chanticleer Consulting Principal Lisa Williams of Building Strong Nonprofits: New Strategies for Growth and Sustainability (John Wiley & Sons, 2010). In addition to his work with nonprofit organizations, he serves as press-box public address announcer for the Cincinnati Bengals and official statistician for Xavier University men's basketball. 
